Write this.

Write what you see.

Write it out in big block letters

so that it can be read on the run.

This vision-message is a witness

pointing to what's coming.

It aches for the coming—it can hardly wait!

And it doesn't lie.

If it seems slow in coming, wait.

It's on its way. It will come right on time.

(Habakkuk 2:2-3 MSG)

In the last issue, I shared how we were in a "hurry up and wait" phase. Over the next several weeks, we are going to feel a shift to writing this vision of our legacy together. I invite you to be active is forward chats and congregational meetings as they come up.

As we write our vision, let's take the advice we read in Habakkuk: let's make the vision as simple and easy to understand as possible. Let's make it big too, so that others will see and feel it's impact. And let's be patient as we do it too, because God's timeline is usually slower than we like it to be. But even when it does feel slow, let's know that it will ultimately be right on time. Our first Forward Chat is on September 15. I'll see you there!

Central Board News and Notes:

The Central Board met July 17th and August 21st as announced in church and weekly E-News.

Rev. Adam and the Central Board discussed Fall worship plans, which will include a new liturgical season on Creation from September 1st through October 6th.

Please plan to attend **Sunday One, September 8**th if you are able, and continue to watch for weekly E-news updates for possible changes and further information, like the **Blessing of the Animals service** that is now in queue for early October.

The Central Board received an update from the Building Our Legacy Team at both summer meetings. They continue to work developing SCC's Archiving Records plan, and met with lawyers to understand how we might go about disposing of our Hard Assets (e.g. church silver, furniture etc.) and Financial Assets, as well as our building and property. The Legacy Team plans to host a Forward Chat September 15, and you can find additional details elsewhere in the Spire. North Shore Christian School's move to the Gordon College Campus has hit a few snags, so they will be starting the school year at Second Church. NSCS Staff is unpacking supplies needed for at least the first 2 months of school, and they are renting a couple of storage PODs you may notice in the parking lot to store other material till they have all approvals needed to move. The PODs will include boxes currently in the parlor that aren't needed immediately. North Shore Recovery High Outreach – you may have noticed over the summer that Recovery High rented lower parish hall and other space for summer sessions on weekdays while their current building underwent asbestos remediation. As we continue our community outreach supporting Recovery High, Rev Adam has agreed to consult on a curriculum module as they explore the impact of different religions on Massachusetts' development, possibly including field trips.

Investment Portfolio/Finance - The Finance Team completed liquidation of our prior investments over the summer and reinvested our assets into a combination of a CD ladder and money market funds, as approved at the May Annual Meeting. Thanks to David Varga for his efforts in simplifying SCC finances as our time horizon shortens. Pledges are a little behind our budget, which we expect will catch up as summer travel season winds down. The team has also made progress streamlining budget accounts including closing several that are no longer needed.

The lift passed state inspection, and during the same visit, our contractor Interstate adjusted the door timer to close with a shorter delay. When you see Jack Terrill and Mary Jane Clark, please thank them for this and all their efforts that go into managing our building needs.
